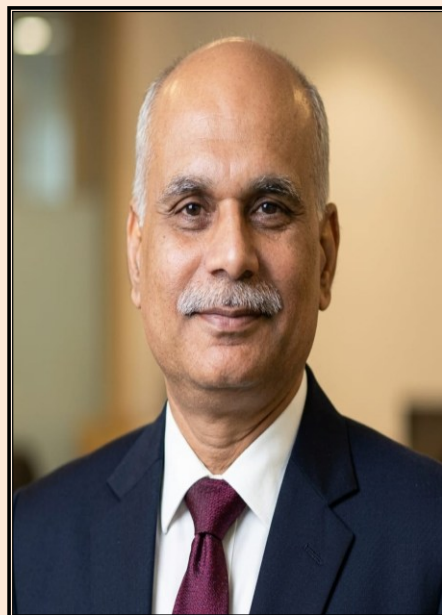

Regarding Admission for the Session 2026-2027

- ❖ Before filling the admission form, you are advised to carefully read the information provided in the College Prospectus/Handbook of information.
- ❖ The completed online admission form should be submitted on or before the dates notified by the Directorate of Higher Education and Himachal Pradesh University.
- ❖ After the approval of the admission form by the Admission Committee of the college, the selected candidates shall deposit the prescribed fees and other dues online within the stipulated time. Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of admission to the respective Programme/Course.
- ❖ The admission shall remain purely provisional and may be cancelled at any stage if the information submitted online is found to be incorrect or misleading.
- ❖ The provisional admission will be confirmed only after the verification of original documents/testimonials by the college authorities.

Ragging is a Criminal Offence

Ragging is a punishable offence, and all forms of ragging are strictly prohibited within the college campus. Any student found indulging in such activities shall be liable for strict disciplinary action as per the law. Any act, directly or indirectly suggestive of ragging, must be immediately reported to the college authorities or the members of the Anti-Ragging Committee. A student found guilty of committing or participating in ragging shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend up to three years and shall also be liable to a fine up to ₹50,000, or both, in accordance with the provisions of law.

रैगिंग एक दण्डनीय अपराध है

रैगिंग एक दण्डनीय अपराध है तथा महाविद्यालय परिसर में सभी प्रकार की रैगिंग पूर्णतः प्रतिबंधित हैं। ऐसे किसी भी कार्य में संलिप्त पाए जाने वाले छात्र/छात्रा के विरुद्ध कानून के अनुसार कड़ी अनुशासनात्मक कार्रवाई की जाएगी। रैगिंग से प्रत्यक्ष अथवा अप्रत्यक्ष रूप से संबंधित किसी भी गतिविधि की सूचना तुरंत महाविद्यालय प्रशासन अथवा एंटी-रैगिंग समिति के सदस्यों को दी जानी चाहिए। रैगिंग करने अथवा उसमें भाग लेने का दोषी पाए जाने वाले छात्र/छात्रा को कानून के प्रावधानों के अनुसार अधिकतम तीन वर्ष तक के कारावास तथा ₹50,000 तक के जुर्माने अथवा दोनों से दंडित किया जा सकता है।

Punishment shall be exemplary and justifiably harsh. Punishment for ragging includes:

- Imprisonment, fine or both.
- Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology.
- Withholding scholarship or other benefits.
- Debarring from representation in events.
- Withholding of results.
- Suspension of expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.

General Admission Rules

For admission to the 1st Semester, a student must not be more than **23 years** of age (**25 years for girls**) as on **1st July 2026**. Accordingly, the applicant should not have been born earlier than **01/07/2003** in the case of boys and **01/07/2001** in the case of girls. However, in respect of SC/ST students, a relaxation of **3 years** is admissible.

The Vice-Chancellor of Himachal Pradesh University has the power to permit age relaxation up to a maximum of **six months**. All such cases may provisionally be granted age relaxation up to six months by the Principal, subject to approval by the Vice-Chancellor. A consolidated list of such cases shall be forwarded for approval.

A candidate who has availed age relaxation at the time of first admission shall also be eligible for the same relaxation in the subsequent classes.

Eligibility for Admission

The candidate should have passed the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the Himachal Pradesh Board of School Education or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto by Himachal Pradesh University.

- Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with the **Science stream** shall be given preference for admission to the **B.Sc. programme**.
- Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with the **Commerce stream** shall be given preference for admission to the **B.Com. programme**.
- Admission shall be made purely on the basis of **merit**. Rounding off of fractional marks shall be permissible as per the prescribed norms.

How to Choose Your Subject Combination?

Students should select their most preferred subject as the Major Subject. After choosing the Major Subject, refer to the table above and select any two subjects from the permitted combinations.

Examples:

If Political Science is chosen as the Major Subject (Sr. No. 9), the student may select any two of the following subjects: History, Hindi, Economics

- ❖ Political Science (Major), 2nd History and 3rd Economics

If Geography is chosen as the Major Subject (Sr. No. 3), the student may select any two of the following subjects: History, Economic, English

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for Undergraduate (UG) Courses

The Himachal Pradesh University vide Letter No. 2-1/2012 H.P.U. (Academic) dated 4 June 2016 has notified the acceptance of the latest course curriculum under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) brought out by the University Grant Commission for implementation of academic session 2026-27.

OUTLINES OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

Core Course: (12 for general courses; 4 discipline specific papers each for regular courses and 2 papers each for English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B.Com.)

Elective Course: Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

Discipline Specific Elective (DSE): (2 each for regular courses): An elective course offered under the main discipline/ subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.

Generic Elective (GE) Course: (2 each for B.A./B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement; (i) Environmental Science and (ii) English/Hindi/MIL Communication/Sanskrit.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): (4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.

Examination & Evaluation System (Annual System)

The Evaluation System in CBCS will consist of two components:

- I. Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE)
- II. End Term / Annual Examination (ETE)

(I) Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE): Accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course. This would have the following components:

(a) Classroom Attendance: Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures / Tutorials / Practicals. 5 marks of the CCE will be awarded on the basis of attendance.

(b) House Exams / Mid-Term Tests: There will be one Mid-Term Test of 15 marks. It is mandatory to appear in the Mid-Term Test and the student must score 45% marks to become eligible for the End-Term Examination.

(c) Seminar / Assignment: 10 marks of the CCE will be awarded on the basis of seminar/assignment etc. that the course teacher may assign to the students.

(II) End-Term / Annual Examination (ETE)

The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will be based on the End-Term / Annual Examination (ETE). The examination will be of three hours duration and will cover the entire syllabus of the course.

Migration from other colleges to this college and vice-versa is governed by HP University Rules. A migration certificate can be issued only if the student is registered with the HP University

Scholarships

Discipline & Conduct Rules

The Principal has the authority to take disciplinary action against students involved in acts of indiscipline, which may result in a fine, suspension, rustication, or expulsion. The following activities shall be treated as violations of college discipline and may invite disciplinary action depending upon the gravity of the offence:

- *Violence, use of force, and ragging.*
- *Making noise and disturbing classes.*
- *Breaking college furniture, doors, windows, etc.*
- *Bringing outsiders to the college campus.*
- *Interfering with electrical wiring/appliances.*
- *Writing on or defacing walls and blackboards.*
- *Eve-teasing.*
- *Smoking, use of gutka, or any intoxicant.*
- *Playing Songs/Music on mobile phones in the campus.*
- *Bringing outsiders into the college campus/premises.*

Identity Card cum Library Card

The Identity Card cum Library Card is an important document which every student must carry daily. In case of loss of the card, the student should submit an application to the Principal along with a fee of Rs. 20/- for the issuance of a duplicate I-Card. The Identity Card cum Library Card should be collected from the Librarian as per the schedule notified by the Librarian.

College Library

Books are issued from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM on all working days. A student must bring his/her Library Card for the issuance of books in his/her name. Only two books may be issued to a student at a time for a period of 14 days. Reference Books, Dictionaries, Newspapers, and Periodicals shall not be issued. If the issued books are not returned by the due date, a fine of Rs. 1/- per book per day shall be charged. In case of loss or damage of an issued book, the student shall either replace the book or deposit its current cost with the permission of the Principal.

Leave Rules

Students should get their leave applications duly recommended by the concerned teachers.

- Leave up to 2 Days shall be sanctioned by the Senior Tutor / Subject Teacher.
- Leave from 3 to 5 days shall be sanctioned by the Vice-Principal.
- Leave for more than 5 Days shall be sanctioned by the Principal.

Re-admission

A student remaining absent continuously for 6 days from any class without proper sanction of leave by the competent authority of the college shall have his/her name automatically struck off from the college rolls. A student remaining absent for 10 days in a month shall also be removed from the rolls. Re-admission shall be allowed on payment of a re-admission fee of ₹ 100 within 7 days after obtaining permission from the Principal. After the expiry of 7 days, the student shall have to pay a re-admission fee of ₹ 200. The recommendation of the concerned teacher shall be necessary and, in addition, the Principal may impose an extra fine depending upon the gravity of the absence. A student whose name is struck off for the second time during the same session shall not be eligible for re-admission to the class.

Co-Curricular and Extra-Curricular Activities

Education is a broad concept and extends beyond the acquisition of textual knowledge. It includes various activities aimed at the multi-dimensional development of an individual's personality. The college provides opportunities to students through several co-curricular and extra-curricular activities which help in the development of a sound body and mind. Keeping this in view, the college has societies such as the Social Science Society, Red Ribbon Club, Eco Club, etc. Students are encouraged to join these societies according to their interests and may approach the concerned incharges for participation.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

The college has two NSS units. Enrolment in NSS is carried out at the beginning of the academic session in the month of August. Students have to apply as and when notified through the notice board for participation in NSS activities. Interested students may contact the NSS Programme Officers for enrolment.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The college has separate NCC wings for boys and girls, and recruitment is done through selection. NCC inculcates the values of discipline, leadership, and service among students. Holders of A, B, and C Certificates are eligible to appear directly for interviews in the Armed Forces.

Rovers and Rangers

The college has one unit each of Rovers and Rangers. It is a voluntary and non-political youth organization wherein students are trained to respond during natural disasters and other emergencies. The organization helps in the all-round development of students and prepares them to become responsible individuals in society, the nation, and the world at large.

Note: Students may opt for either NCC or NSS or Rovers and Rangers.

College Students Central Association (CSCA)

The College Students Central Association is constituted every year as per the rules laid down by Himachal Pradesh University from time to time. At present, the selection for various posts of the Association is made on the basis of merit through the indirect selection mode.

Parent Teachers Association (PTA)

To encourage community participation in education, the Parent Teachers Association (PTA) has been established under Sections 2.33 to 2.33.7 of the HP Education Code, 2001. It is a non-political body that promotes coordination and interaction between parents and teachers for the improvement of academic standards and infrastructural facilities of the college.

Sports

Sports provide students with opportunities for achievement, recognition, and personality development. To encourage participation in sports, the college provides facilities for both indoor and outdoor games. Students are encouraged to participate in various games and prepare for inter-college tournaments organized by Himachal Pradesh University. In addition, the college also provides a well-equipped gymnasium on the campus.

Renuka Dhara: Annual College Magazine

To encourage creative abilities among students, the annual college magazine Renuka Dhara is published every year. The magazine consists of several sections, each managed by one staff editor and one student editor. Students are encouraged to contribute original poems, articles, stories, memoirs, experiences, and other literary writings. The magazine also presents a panoramic summary of the year-long activities of the college through pictorial representation.

Educational Tours

For the overall development of students, stream-wise educational tours are organized from time to time. The purpose of these tours is observation, non-experimental research, and providing students with practical exposure outside their routine academic environment, including educational visits and camping activities with teachers and classmates.

Annual Prize Distribution

Various awards and prizes are presented to meritorious students in academics as well as to those excelling in sports and co-curricular activities during the Annual Prize Distribution Function as per college norms.

Career Guidance & Counselling Cell

The Career Guidance & Counselling Cell guides students regarding various career opportunities available to them. Advertisements related to different posts and training programmes from newspapers are displayed on the notice board for the benefit of students. Resource persons are also invited from time to time for guidance and counselling sessions.

Mentor Cell

Students are encouraged to interact with their teachers regarding academic, non-academic, or personal issues. Appropriate help and guidance are provided to cater to the needs of students. The Mentor Cell is also an essential and integral part of the IQAC.
